WHAT WE GROW:



Lindbergh students like ready-toeat produce such as sugar snap peas and Sun Gold tomatoes.



Lindbergh families and community members grow vegetables in plots surrounding the school garden.



During the summer, we donate our produce to the Kennedy Heights food pantry.

TIPS:



Our raised beds are framed with composite lumber. They help build up the soil and protect plants from foot traffic.



We built a sifter out of 2 x 2's and hardware cloth to remove trash and lumps of clay from city compost. The kids love sifting!



We use floating row covers to extend our growing season. Then we are able to harvest greens into the winter months!
